
The Divine Mercy Saint



If someone asked you to name just one characteristic of God, what would you say? If Saint Faustina Kowalska had been asked this question, she probably would have replied, "God is mercy."

Saint Faustina was born in Poland in 1905 and was baptized Helen Kowalska. She came from a family of poor farmers.

When Helen was seven years old, she heard Jesus' voice within her, encouraging her to become a saint. Later, she wanted to become a nun, but her parents needed her to help support the family. When Helen was nineteen, she entered the Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy. She took the religious name Sister Maria Faustina of the Most Blessed Sacrament.

During the next several years, Jesus appeared to Sister Faustina many times. In one vision, Sister Faustina saw two rays of light, one red and one white, pouring forth from Jesus' heart. Jesus told Sister Faustina that the red and white rays represented the blood and water that poured forth from his heart when he was pierced with a sword as he hung on the cross. He explained that his blood is the life of souls and the water from his side makes souls righteous.

Jesus told Sister Faustina to share with the world that he is the Divine Mercy. He loves each one of us, no matter how great our sins. Jesus told Sister Faustina that he wants all people to trust in him and in his mercy.

Sister Faustina spent the rest of her life praying that people would accept the love and mercy of Jesus. At the end of her short life, she became very ill. As she lay

dying, she said, "My one occupation is to live in the presence of my heavenly Father."

Sister Faustina died in 1938. We celebrate her feast day on October 5.
